- **8:00 9:00 Welcome: Day 2 -** Your hosts will outline the CME program for the conference along with a tablet and turning point technology demonstration.
- 9:00 10:00 Medical Leadership for Women's Health: Patient Safety Concepts, The Harvard Experience Dr. Nicolas Leyland

Dr. Leyland will review the evolution of the patient safety and quality movement and for the participants to 'get' our role as physicians in assuring quality.

- 9:00 10:00 Test Your Contraception IQ: Be a Contraceptive Mythbuster! Dr. Nicholas Leyland

Dr. Leyland will separate fact from myth with respect to common beliefs about birth control and identify opportunities to change contraceptive practices, reduce failure, and improve satisfaction. He will also discuss how to reassure patients about the relative safety of contraception and help delegates understand the different forms of contraception and their indications at different phases of a woman's life.

- 10:00 11:00 Sepsis: The #1 Killer of Hospitalized Patients Dr. Frederick Goldberg During this session, Dr. Goldberg will discuss the Third International Consensus Definitions for Sepsis and Septic Shock. He will also review the importance of early identification and treatment of septic patients and know the components of the qSOFA score and the implications of a positive qSOFA. Delegates will also understand the components of the 3 hour and 6 hour care bundles for sepsis.

Dr. Goldberg will discuss the reasoning behind U.S. federal penalties for excessive 30-day hospital readmissions and the medical risk factors for readmission. He will also review the principal diagnostic groups for which hospital readmission reductions penalties have been targeted and the difference between all-cause and potentially preventable readmissions.

9:00 – 10:00 Your College Peer Assessment: What You Need to Know

Dr. David Finkelstein

Dr. Finkelstein will clarify the Peer Assessment Process, including the purpose, methods of assessment and possible outcomes. He will also illustrate common deficiencies/issues arising during a Peer Assessment and how to prepare yourself, your office and your notes for a Peer Assessment.

10:00 – 11:00 Leadership Part II: Leadership Pearls from Harvard and Beyond Dr. Barry Nathanson

During Part II, Dr. Nathanson will discuss some of the history of modern management and leadership thinking along with some of the science behind human motivation. He will also review some key Pearls on teams and teambuilding, conflict management and negotiation along with the essence of innovation and influence and dual-process thinking.

11:00 – 12:00 Understanding Systems, (the impact of complexity on patient care) and Learning from Error - Dr. Nicholas Leyland

Dr. Leyland will review how systems thinking can improve health care and minimize patient adverse events. He will also explain what is meant by the terms "system" and "complex system" as they relate to health care and why a systems approach to patient safety is superior to the traditional approach. He will also review the nature of error and how health care can learn from error to improve patient safety.

Dr. Goldberg will review what empathy is and how it differs from sympathy and compassion. He will also discuss the four fundamental requirements for generating empathy and the language and techniques that promote empathic behaviours. Throughout the session he will review the far-reaching positive impact on the patient experience that empathy promotes and help delegates be familiar with the positive return that empathy brings to practitioners.

- 8:00 9:00 Cool or Just Not Hot? Using Temperature Control to Improve Outcomes Post Arrest Dr. Barry Nathanson

Dr. Nathanson will discuss the ancient history and modern history of using the protective benefits of cool temperatures with examples used in the 'HACA' and 'Bernard' trials along with the ongoing debates in the field.

9:00 – 10:00 HPV in Head and Neck Cancer: The Emerging Clinical Picture

Dr. David Finkelstein

During this session, delegates will have an appreciation of the changing nature in the Etiology and Treatment of HPV related Head and Neck Cancers, particularly Oropharynx. Dr. Finkelstein will discuss the association of HPV / Head and Neck Cancers and Sexual behavior and the treatment(s) available and the post treatment challenges seen clinically. He will also review the emerging role of vaccines in the possible mitigation of the burden of Head and Neck HPV cancers.

Dr. Finkelstein will discuss the Anatomy of the Upper Airway, and the common sites of obstruction. He will also review the common and rare causes of UAO and how to develop a triage plan when faced with UAO and what can and cannot, or shouldn't be done before definitive care is available.

4:00 – 5:00 Hospital Acquired Infections and Medication Errors: Unacceptable Dangers - Dr. Frederick Goldberg

Dr. Goldberg will discuss where medical error ranks as a cause of mortality and the underlying conditions that allow for medical errors. He will also review the components of a safety culture and the various types of hospital acquired infections. Delegates will become aware of the care bundles to reduce hospital acquired infections.

5:00 – 6:00 'MAiD in Ontario': Update on Medical Assistance in Dying Dr. Barry Nathanson

During this session, Dr. Nathanson will give an overview of the evolution of the Right to Die movement and the current legislation on MAiD. He will also discuss the process of applying for MAiD and the peripheral issues surrounding MAiD and the current Ontario statistics on MAiD.

- 9:00 10:00 'Out, out damn spot!' Should we Feel Guilty About Diagnostic Error Rates? Dr. Barry Nathanson

Dr. Nathanson will review the evidence in support of high rates of diagnostic error and the key factors behind the (purported) high rates of diagnostic error. He will also discuss the various kinds of cognitive biases and education strategies to reduce diagnostic error.

10:00 – 11:00 Communication and Teamwork: A New Paradigm for Healthcare Dr. Frederick Goldberg

Delegates will understand during this session the increasing risk to patients stemming from communication failures and lack of teamwork. Dr. Goldberg will review how teamwork depends on building collective trust and what a shared mental model is along with the concept of Psychological Safety. He will review some of the following tools: SBAR, brief, huddle, debrief, checkback, STEP, CUS, Two Challenge Rule.

11:00 – 12:00 Thyroidectomy Through the Ages: A Lens to Examine the History of Surgery - Dr. David Finkelstein

Dr. Finkelstein will review the evolution of the surgical management of Thyroid Disease and the role of individuals Surgical Giants (Kocher, Bilroth, Lahey) in the management of Thyroid Disease. He will also discuss how Thyroid surgery has changed with the times and the rold of surgery in malignant and benign Thyroid disease.
